

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




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




TEACHING NOTES

Using the companion text *This is the Way We Go to School* by Edith Baer, students discover some of the different ways children get to school in countries all over the world.





Preparation

2 copies of the transportation icons -page 62 sheets of chart paper

For each student:

- a world map page 7 (color) OR page 8 (b/w)
- Where & How chart page 9
- bar graph page 10 OR page 11
- bar graph questions page 12
- creative writing prompt page 13

Sharing the Book

Before Reading

- Ask students to share how they got to school this morning.
- Explain that you are going to read a book that tells about the different ways kids around the world go to school.
- Introduce the world map and the Where & How chart as tools for recording information from the book.

During Reading

- Locate each country on the world map.
- Record the place (where) and type of transportation (how) on the chart.

After Reading

- Explain that these are just examples and do not represent how every child in that country gets to school.
- Review the map and chart.
- Discuss observations such as why a certain place might use a particular type of transportation, similarities, differences, favorites, etc.

TEACHING NOTES CONTINUED



Class Graphing Activity

Make a class **bar graph** showing how the students in the classroom go to school. Explain that for this graph they will need to choose which one they *most usually* use to get to school: feet (includes walking, riding a bike, scooter, etc.), car, or bus.

Introduce the class **tally chart**, and explain that you will be using it as a tool to collect the class **data** (responses). As you call on each student, model/review how to record the data as tallies on the chart pad.

Explain that the data from the tally chart is going to be used to create a bar graph to display the results. Introduce/review bar graphs as needed.




Model/review how to transfer the data from the tally chart to the bar graph.

Students complete their own bar graph worksheet.

NOTE: There are two versions to choose from: with, and without, labels and numbers.

Analyze the graph, and answer the questions on the worksheet as a class, in small groups, with a partner or independently.



Independent Creative Writing

- Students create new ways to get to school.
- Share in small groups.
- Make a class book using the student pages.







