



Help the animals find their homes!




Cut out each animal and place it where it lives on the map.




Bison (North America) can run up to 35 miles (56 km) per hour. That's as fast as a car! They are the largest land animal in North America.




Chinchilla (South America) fur is extremely soft and thick. It protects them from the cold night air in the mountains where they live.



Koalas (Australia) spend up to 18 hours a day sleeping! They get very little energy from the eucalyptus leaves they eat.




The **baleen whale** (Antarctica) has no teeth. It uses a comb-shaped part of its mouth, called a baleen, to trap tiny ocean creatures.



A **clawed frog** (Africa) can burrow in the mud and lie dormant — in a special kind of deep sleep — for up to a year.



Pandas (Asia) spend about 12 hours a day eating!



A **grey wolf** (Europe) can eat 20 to 30 pounds (9 to 13 kg) of meat in one meal. That's about as much as three turkeys!
